Scarlett Fever update

There have been cases of scarlet fever within the South West recently and the school has received advice from the department of Public Health. Advice is as follows:

Early symptoms of scarlet fever include sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. After 12 to 48 hours the characteristic red, pinhead rash develops, typically first appearing on the chest and stomach, then rapidly spreading to other parts of the body.

*As per national Guidance on Infection Control in Schools and other Child Care Settings, children and adults with suspected scarlet fever should be **excluded** from nursery / school / work. They may return to their place of work, if they are feeling better but only **24 hours** after commencement of antibiotics. The antibiotic course for a Scarlet fever infection is 10 days and it is important that the full course of antibiotics is completed, even if the patient has started to feel better. Good hygiene practice such as hand washing remains the most important step in preventing and controlling spread of infection.*
